DESCRIPTION

It is a requirement of the Health & Safety law that employers should provide a safe and healthy environment for their employees. If the assessment of First Aid needs highlights the need for qualified First Aider's, then this Level 3 qualification (Level 6 in Scotland) will provide you with suitable, highly trained personnel.

This comprehensive three-day course covers a wide range of First Aid emergencies, enabling all participants to deal with an emergency situation with confidence in a prompt, safe and effective way. Additionally, this course will include any protocol changes that may have arisen since their last training course. This course will give the participants a qualification to the highest level of First Aid, meeting the statutory requirements of the Health & Safety (First Aid) Regulations 1981.

DURATION

A minimum of 18 hours spread over three days, each day consists of theoretical and practical work.

ASSESSMENT AND MARKING

Practical assessment is ongoing. Our Trainer will only award a pass if they believe the delegates have displayed the requisite understanding and competencies at the end of each session throughout the course, and successfully completed the question paper on each day.

CERTIFICATION

A three-year Level 3 Award in First Aid at Work will be issued to the learner, subject to successful assessment. No external assessors are required. The two-day Refresher course is due in three years time.

NUMBERS

A maximum of 12 students can be accommodated; all learners must be a minimum of 16 years of age.
