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#### **DESCRIPTION**

Where a workplace first aid risk assessment identifies a need for a First Aider in the Workplace, this three-day qualification meets the requirements of the Health and Safety (First Aid) Regulations 1981 and the Health and Safety (First Aid) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1982, therefore providing you with suitable, highly trained personnel.

The learner will attain knowledge and the practical competence required to deal with a range of workplace first aid situations.

This comprehensive three-day course covers a wide range of first aid emergencies, enabling all participants to deal with emergency situations with confidence in a prompt, safe and effective way. In addition, this course will include any protocol changes that may have arisen since their last training course.

#### **ENTRY REQUIREMENTS**

The qualification is available to learners aged 14 or over but a learner is unable to act as a First Aider in the workplace until they reach the age of 16.

Due to the practical nature of the first aid assessment there are physical demands and learners must be able to demonstrate their skills as in a real-life situation. An example of this would be to demonstrate CPR on a manikin at floor level.

It is recommended that learners should hold a minimum of Level 1 in literacy or equivalent to undertake this qualification. It may be possible to allocate a reasonable adjustment to a learner who has a disability, medical condition or learning need; learners are invited to speak to a member of the Tineke Training Ltd team prior to the course. They can also approach the Instructor on the day of the course to disclose anything they feel needs to be made aware of. All disclosures of information is treated discreetly, respectfully and confidentially.

#### **DURATION**

A minimum of 18 hours spread over at least three days. Ideally, the course should be run over three consecutive days, but we have the flexibility to accommodate your specific needs if you so desire providing it is completed within 10 weeks of starting the course and the training sessions last for a minimum of two hours.

#### **ASSESSMENT**

The qualification is assessed through practical demonstration, oral questioning and written assessment. A learner must successfully pass both the written and practical assessments to achieve the qualification. There is no grading of the assessment; learners pass or are referred.



#### **CERTIFICATION**

A three-year Level 3 Award in First Aid at Work (Level 6 in Scotland) will be issued to the learner, subject to successful assessment. The certificate expires as per the date on the certificate. At this point, the learner can participate on the two-day, Level 3 Award First Aid at Work Re-qualification course.

#### **NUMBERS**

A maximum of 12 students per Instructor can be accommodated on this course.
